The Installation of Great Officers

On Thursday 10 November, Sir Malcolm Ross GCVO OBE was installed as the 18th Lord Prior by the Grand Prior His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester. At the same time, The Right Reverend Timothy John Stevens CBE was enthroned as the 8th Prelate, and Mr John Mah CD QC installed as the 4th Sub-Prior.

The Lord Prior is the third most senior individual within the Order, under the Sovereign Head the Queen, and the Grand Prior

The role of the Prelate is to advise the Grand Prior in all ecclesiastical matters concerning the Order; while the Sub-Prior ensures all circumstances and concerns of Independent Commanderies and St John Associations around the world are brought to the attention of the Grand Council.

The Installation of Great Officers took place in the Priory Church of the Order of St John in London in the presence of representatives from the 11 Pories, England and the Islands, Scotland, Wales, South Africa, New Zealand, Canada, Australia, USA, Kenya, Singapore and Hong Kong; 4 Commanderies, of Ards in Northern Ireland, Jersey, Guernsey, and the Isle of Man; and St John Associations from around the world.

In his address to the congregation, Sir Malcolm Ross spoke of the notion of St John moving forward and broadening the membership. He also pledged to lead St John in the coming years, ensuring the leadership becomes more representative of the organisation as a whole.

Earthquake heroes in New Zealand: Ambulance volunteers go beyond the call

Two heroic St John volunteers from Kaikoura, New Zealand responded during the magnitude 7.8 earthquake on 14 November.

Ginnaya MacDonald heroically went on duty after taking her children to a safe place.

She explained to her perplexed 8, 9 and 12-year-olds that she had to leave.

"I said, 'I have to go'. Breaking that to the kids was quite hard. They were crying. People said, 'You don't have to go'. I said, 'No, I do. I can't in good conscience stay here.'"

Her partner drove her to the ambulance station. She was worried about the roads - daylight revealed wide cracks in the highway between South Bay and the



The huge quake ripped up roads throughout the town main town.

At the ambulance station, in the heart of the tsunami zone, Sara van Reenen had forced open one jammed door and driven out one ambulance. The second had to be manoeuvred out the same door.

In the pitch black, they negotiated damaged roads and bridges to transport patients with fractured femurs and fractured hips. People were ill from the sheer shock. It was busy, but not chaotic.

MacDonald's children are proud of what she does.

She explains, *"I'm loving being able to do something. That's why I volunteer."*

Teaching first aid to the community in Cambodia



As part of their continued efforts to teaching everyone basic first aid in Cambodia, officers and members of the St John Brigade Singapore, Phnom Penh division partnered with Techo Voluntary Youth Doctor Association (TYDA) on a joint mission to Koh Kong Province.

Together the two organisations conducted first aid lessons to over 400 high school students and 187 villagers at Koh Kong, Cambodia.

Saving lives during a fire outbreak at a hospital in Malaysia



After a serious fire broke out in one of the wings of Sultanah Aminah Hospital in Johor, Malaysia, the St John Ambulance Kluang branch responded by assisting with the evacuation of patients and the injured.

Using ambulance vehicles donated by the public, 20 members from the St John Ambulance Kluang were able to transport the patients to the nearest hospital.

Helping Alice to become a mother of a healthy child



Alice is from rural Malawi, and by the time she was 34 years old she had five pregnancies. Three of her babies died at birth.

She had never gone to any health check-ups during pregnancy because she simply didn't know how important they are. She also never learned how to make sure her own health and the health of her child were protected.

During her most recent pregnancy, Alice was visited by St John Malawi volunteers who were providing support to households for healthy motherhood. For the first time ever, Alice learned about frequent check-ups that can help to spot problems early enough, from pregnancy right through the first weeks of the infant's life.

The local volunteers also encouraged her to have a safe delivery at a health centre, where a trained health worker can act immediately if complications occur. Happily, Alice gave birth to a healthy child.

Across Sub-Saharan Africa, there is an unacceptably high number of mothers and newborn infants who die each year. But it doesn't take a lot to help a mother and her baby through a safe delivery and in the first months after birth.

Hurricane Matthew began as a tropical storm off the coast of Africa in late September. Within six days, it had intensified to a strong tropical storm and escalated to a highly destructive hurricane.

As part of Jamaica's national support and recovery efforts, St John Ambulance Jamaica mobilised teams of volunteers and members to visit major shelters and help to attend vulnerable groups as well as providing ambulance services where possible.

Jamaica was on the storm's path, but managed to escape with minimal damage, but Haiti was not as fortunate.
