History of The Order of St John

The origins of the Order of St John can be traced to an 11th century hospital - the Hospital of St John in Jerusalem. In 1113, the people who administered this hospital were formed into a religious Order. Soon after, they took on military duties and became known as Knights Hospitallers.

That Order, which still exists today, is now commonly known as the Order of Malta. It recruited members and owned property throughout Western Europe. The Order's principal property in Scotland was at Torphichen in West Lothian. Being Roman Catholic, the medieval Order ceased to function in England from April 1540, and in Scotland from 1565 when the Reformation took place in the reign of Mary Queen of Scots.

In the first half of the 19th century, a group of people set out to revive the Order of Malta in the United Kingdom, but ultimately formed themselves into a separate organisation which they called the 'Order of St John', which had no official recognition. In 1877, they founded the St John Ambulance Association, whose role was to provide training in first aid and similar activities. Ten years later, the St John Ambulance Brigade was created, as a uniformed body of trained volunteers to provide first aid cover to the public.

In 1882, as a further means of providing to those in need and recognising its origins, the Order opened a hospital in Jerusalem. This was to treat eye disease, prevalent in the Middle East.

In 1888, Queen Victoria made the Order a Royal Order of Chivalry, with the monarch as its Sovereign Head. Since then, the Grand Prior has always been a member of the Royal Family.

Today, the Order of St John functions throughout the United Kingdom, in many other Commonwealth countries, in the United States of America, and at the hospital in Jerusalem.



The Order in Scotland

In its early years, the Order provided training in first aid and related subjects in Scotland, as in other parts of the United Kingdom. However, the Scottish-based St Andrew's Ambulance Association was formed later and began similar activities, both in Scotland and in England.

In 1908, an agreement was reached that St Andrews would cease first aid training south of the border, and St John north of it. In the 1940s, some of its members felt that there was scope for the Order to undertake a variety of public services in Scotland, so in 1947, the Scottish Priory of the Order was established.

Over the years, the Priory of Scotland of the Order of St John responded to changes to some of these needs brought about by developments such as the creation and evolution of the National Health Service. This ranged from the building and managing of care homes, to the provision of vehicles to other charitable organisations.

In more recent times, under the banner St John Scotland, members of the Order alongside other volunteers continue to help communities in need through charitable works. Patient Transport services have been established to help those undergoing treatment for cancer or dialysis get to regular hospital appointments without having to rely on public transport.

St John Scotland is also helping the nation be more resilient in the face of sudden cardiac arrest, by supporting local communities to install Public Access Defibrillators, and offering free CPR training to people of all ages. We also continue to support Scottish Mountain Rescue teams and a Mountain Safety initiative in partnership with Mountaineering Scotland.

As well as work at home, St John Scotland has long supported the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital Group, as well as services run by colleagues in St John Malawi.

The Order of St John Today

Membership of the Order (as an Order of Chivalry) is conferred in recognition of work done in furthering its objects. Recommendations for admission to, or promotion in, the Order may be made by the chairs of the Area committees and by Grade I or II members.

Such recommendations are subject to scrutiny by the Priory Honours and Awards Committee, and are then submitted to Her Majesty the Queen for approval. New and promoted members are invested with their insignia at the Festival of St John, held annually in Scotland on or around the 24th of June (St John Baptist Day).

The Roll of Members of the Order in the Priory of Scotland is maintained in the Chancery. A member may request a copy of his or her recorded particulars at any time.



Grades of the Order

Under its Sovereign Head, Her Majesty The Queen, the Order has five grades:

- I** Bailiff & Dame Grand Cross, GCStJ
- II** Knight & Dame (of Justice or of Grace), KStJ & DStJ
- III** Commander, CStJ
- IV** Officer, OStJ
- V** Member, MStJ
- Clerical grades (eg. CHStJ) were withdrawn from use, however those holding them may wish to continue to use them

Foundation Dues and Oblations

To carry out its charitable works as St John Scotland, the Priory depends to a great extent on contributions from its members. Order members are relied upon for two set contributions: Foundation Dues, payable on admission to, and promotion within the Order; and Annual Oblations, payable annually on a scale related to grade within the Order.

Order of St John Service Medal

All those who make a significant contribution to the charitable works of the Order of St John (whether or not they are a member) is entitled to apply for the Order's Service Medal.

The service medal is bestowed when an individual has completed at least 60 hours' service each year for ten years. Bars are added to the service medal to denote further years' service. This year, an ultra-long service medal has been introduced to recognise those who have contributed 50 years' service. Bars may be added to this medal up to 70 years' service.

Order of St John Award for Organ Donation



The Order of St John Award for Organ Donation is a UK-wide initiative in partnership with NHS Blood and Transplant (NHSBT).

Since 2013, the awards have been presented to the families of those who have lost loved ones within the past year, but whose decision to donate their organs helped saved the lives of others.

In Scotland, the awards are presented at a ceremony in Edinburgh during Organ Donation Week each year. The award itself is inscribed with the words "Add Life, Give Hope".

St John House, Edinburgh

The Chancery, or headquarters, of the Priory of Scotland is located at St John House, 21 St John Street, Edinburgh. This early eighteenth-century house lies off the Royal Mile a little below the site of St John's Cross in the Canongate. It was originally built for the Wemyss family and was generously gifted to the Order in 1971 by the late James Watt KStJ.

Chapter Room

On the first floor of St John House is the Chapter Room, which was relocated to its present location from the original Chancery building in Woodlands Terrace, Glasgow, when St John House was adopted as the Chancery in 1971.

The Chapter Room includes a Prior's chair and table, and tables for the Chancellor and Preceptor of Torphichen. Stall plates depict the arms of living and deceased Knights and Dames of Justice.

Recent work undertaken by the Director of Ceremonies to improve the Chapter Room has seen the repositioning of the stall plates, previously displayed either side of the chairs of the Chancellor and the Preceptor, above the stall seats in chronological order of appointment as Knight or Dame of Justice. Stall plates of the most recent knights were painted by the Priory Limner. Mounted across three of the four walls, this displays a magnificent collection of heraldry of knights and dames of the Order in Scotland. Over the coming years, the collection will increase as further knights and dames are appointed.



Library

The library of St John Scotland is contained within St John's House. It has a fascinating collection of books, documents, photographs and objects relating to the Order from its origins to the present day. Torphichen Preceptory

The first property in Scotland of the pre-Reformation Order was established at Torphichen in West Lothian. Acquired during the reign of David I, King of Scots (1124-1153), it became, and remained until the 16th century, the Order's administrative centre in Scotland. It was also a hospital and a place of worship.

The tower and transepts of the Preceptory building remain and the property is under the stewardship of Historic Environment Scotland.

With the help of volunteers organised by St John Scotland's West Lothian committee, the Preceptory is open to the public over weekends and bank holidays from 1st April to 30th September, between 1pm and 5pm. New volunteers are welcome and should contact volunteer@stjohnscotland.org.uk for more information.

Governance of the Order

The Order of St John is a separate body from its Priors and other establishments, and is registered with the Charity Commission of England and Wales. The Trustees are the Great Officers of the Order, the Priors of each Priory or their appointed representative, and the Order Hospitaller. Together, they form the Grand Council.

Grand Council meets once per year, and deals with matters beyond the responsibility of any one particular establishment, including Order-wide policy and strategy. The Great Officers and the Grand Council are supported by the Secretary-General, who heads a small secretariat in London. Each of the Priors, Commanderies and St John Associations has its own constitution. They are subject to the Charter, Statutes and Regulations of the Order, but within that they have a wide degree of autonomy.

In Grateful Memory

Amongst others lost to the Order over the past year were the following Grade I & II members.

Sir Malcolm Ross GCVO OBE GCStJ

Born: 27 October 1943

Died: 27 October 2019

Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Malcolm Ross was Prior of Scotland from 2009 to 2015 and served as the Order's Lord Prior from 2016 until 2019. He was a diplomatic servant of the Crown for 30 years, overseeing with scrupulous efficiency two royal funerals, several weddings and many state occasions.

Walter Hugh Ross was brought up at Netherhall, Bridge of Dee, Kirkcudbrightshire, where he lived all his life when not in the army or on royal duties. He attended Eton and then Sandhurst where he won the sword of honour and was commissioned into the Scots Guards in 1964.

He remained with the Scots Guards until 1987 serving in Aden and as officer-in-command at the Guards Depot at Pirbright. He had six tours of duty in Northern Ireland and was mentioned in dispatches. He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel in 1982.

In 1987 he joined the royal household initially as an auditor to the Household and a Comptroller overseeing the working methods throughout the Palace. Other duties included secretary to the Orders of Knighthood when, in 1991, he was appointed comptroller of the Lord Chamberlain's office. In that post Sir Malcolm assumed control of all the ceremonial and official events which involved the Queen. These varied from the state opening of Parliament, state visits, investitures and Buckingham Palace Garden Parties.

Sir Malcolm retired from working at Buckingham Palace in 2006 and was appointed master of the Prince of Wales's household.

Sir Malcolm retained close connections with Kirkcudbrightshire throughout his life. He served as Lord-Lieutenant for the Stewartry of Kirkcudbright (2006-2018) taking particular pride in upholding the ancient title of Stewartry - an alternative name for the county. He also served as a Captain in the Queen's Body Guard for Scotland, the Royal Company of Archers, retiring from office shortly before his death.

Sir Malcolm was appointed a Commander of the Royal Victorian Order in 1994, Knight Commander in 1999, and Knight Grand Cross in 2005, all three honours being in the personal gift of the Queen.

Sir Malcolm married Susan Gow in 1969. She and their son and two daughters survive him.

Major Martin Cruickshank of Auchreoch KStJ FRGS

Born: 17 September 1933

Died: 4 May 2019

Martin Melvin Cruickshank, a stalwart of the Order for many years, was made Knight in 1982. A member of Chapter for over a quarter-of-a-century from 1970, he was sword bearer for nearly two decades from 1977, always cutting a tall immaculate figure.

Educated at Rugby and Cambridge, Martin was commissioned into the Gordon Highlanders, and served as Brigade Major in the Royal Nigerian Army.

A noted adventurer across the globe, he and his late wife Rona travelled across territories from the Arctic to the Equator. He enjoyed a particular fondness for crossing deserts, and on one expedition, drove across the Sahara. An experienced rally driver, Martin represented the British Army at championships in 1961, 1965 and 1966. His many other interests included bird watching, golf and music, besides having a wide knowledge of wines.

Major Cruickshank inherited arms from his father, and used his heraldry widely.

Sir David Blackstock McNee KStJ QPM

Born: 23 March 1925

Died: 30 April 2019

Sir David Blackstock McNee was a Glaswegian law officer who rose through the ranks to become one of the most outstanding and prominent figures in the service in the 1970s and 80s. A former chief constable of City of Glasgow Police, he was appointed to lead the Metropolitan force in 1977 and was in charge at the time of some high-profile challenges including the siege of the Iranian Embassy and the Brixton riots.

Born in Glasgow in 1925, he was tremendously proud of his Scottish roots. After leaving school he joined the Clydesdale Bank but was soon called up to serve in the Royal Navy in 1943. In the Second World War he was a telegraphist on HMS Empire Mace, seeing active service and being involved in the D-Day landings in Normandy.

On leaving the Navy, after the war, he joined City of Glasgow Police in 1946 and in 1951 was appointed to the marine division in Govan as detective constable. He rose through the ranks and was appointed assistant chief constable of Dunbartonshire Police in 1969, then becoming chief constable of City of Glasgow Police in 1971.

When it was decided to combine the six Scottish regions into Strathclyde, it was Sir David who was responsible for the amalgamation of all the forces and he made a point of visiting each station across the region.

He was extremely proud to be invited to become commissioner of the Metropolitan police

in 1977 and continued the investigations of Operation Countryman into corruption within the police, which had been instigated by his predecessor. The operation led to the Met getting rid of some 400 officers suspected of corruption.

In his tenure at the Met, Sir David was involved in many high-profile cases including the crisis at the Iranian Embassy in 1980 when it was seized by six Iranian exiles demanding the release of prisoners in Iran.

The siege was just one of the considerable tests Sir David faced during his tenure - he was also in charge in 1982 when Michael Fagan was able to scale the railings of Buckingham Palace, climb through a window and get into the Queen's bedroom - but he rose to the challenge as commissioner and was held in the highest regard, by both his force and government ministers. Other forces, worldwide, sought his advice and experience, which were greatly appreciated and he developed friendships which continued throughout his life.

Sir David was knighted in 1978 and retired in 1982 but enjoyed a very busy and fruitful retirement, holding directorships with Clydesdale Bank, Trusthouse Forte, Scottish Express Newspapers and Integrated Security Services. He also acted as an adviser to British Airways.

He had been an active member of the Boys' Brigade in his youth and as such, was keen to continue to be supportive, eventually becoming honorary president.

Mr Robert Leitch KStJ CA

Born: 25 May 1929

Died: 18 May 2019

Robert (Bob) Leitch was born in the East End of Glasgow to Jessie and James Leitch. Shortly afterwards, the family emigrated to Canada, however they returned just a few years later and settled again in Parkhead.

When he was six, Robert's parents divorced, resulting in his formative years being entrusted to his maternal grandparents, of whom he was extremely fond. As a child, he could be found most Saturday evenings at the Glasgow City Mission with his grandmother, belting out hymns with the Salvation Army.

During the Second World War, Robert was evacuated to Perth. As an unaccompanied minor he was placed in a local convent - an experience he did not enjoy. When his grandfather sent him a postal order he scaled the convent wall, took himself to the post office, cashed it in and promptly got a bus home. Wartime schooling was interspersed with work on behalf of the Forestry Commission in Dumfries and Galloway.

Aged 16, Robert's headmaster recommended him to chartered accountancy firm Gillespie and Anderson for an apprenticeship. He was a year too young so until his 17th birthday, he

worked as an audit clerk for the firm.

In 1947, aged 18, Robert was called for national service, and joined the Navy, following in his beloved grandfather's footsteps. In 1949 he returned to his studies at Glasgow University and qualified as a Chartered Accountant in 1952. He became a full partner at Gillespie and Anderson in 1956, and remained there until his retirement in 1991.

Robert enjoyed playing golf and watching football, but holidays were his passion. Along with wife Chrissie, and children Carolyn, David and Robbie, he spent many happy holidays in Newquay in Cornwall as well as at their caravan in Dumfries and Galloway.

Robert Leitch was a member of the Trades House of Glasgow and served as Deacon of the Incorporation of Tailors in 1970. He became a member of Glasgow Kilwinning Lodge Number 4 in 1963 and was installed as Master in December 1973. He went on to hold several offices in the Provincial Grand Lodge of Glasgow and the Grand Lodge of Scotland.

He contributed tirelessly to the charitable work of the Order of St John. Having been made a Member in 1984, he rose through the ranks and was invested as Knight by the Duke of Gloucester in 2007.

Major John Gooch KStJ VRD FRICS

Born: 9 December 1935

Died: 16 April 2020

Jan Gooch, always engagingly courteous and pleasant, was known as someone determined to extract the most from life. On this, he led a full one.

After National Service with 42 Commando Royal Marines, he went on to serve with the Royal Marines Reserve, rising to the rank of major, and gaining the Voluntary Reserve Decoration more than half-a-century ago.

A chartered surveyor by profession, Jan was invested as Member in 1993, though his connections with the Order preceded that. An active member of Chapter 2011-2013, he went on to be appointed assistant director of ceremonies for eight years in 2002, as well as become the very active chairman of Angus and Dundee Area. In lieu of his exemplary local service, the area latterly made him their Hon Vice-President. He was promoted KStJ in 2006.

Major John Daniel Gooch took understandable pride in his lineage, being a great-great-grandson of Sir Daniel Gooch, locomotive engineer to the Great Western Railway. The railway connection is maintained to the present day, through Jan displaying a locomotive wheel in his arms.

William Arthur Spence KStJ QPM LLB BA

Born: 20 November 1943

Died: 10 May 2020

Bill Spence was a stalwart of the Angus & Dundee area of St John Scotland, and a well respected local figure, having served as Tayside Police Chief Constable throughout the 1990s.

Bill grew up in Ellon, Aberdeenshire. He left school with no qualifications, but went on to night college then the Open University before going to Strathclyde University to study law. His police career began in Paisley, but took him to Rothesay, operations with Interpol, and even India, before he ended up in Tayside. Bill's first role for the local division came in 1988 when he was appointed Deputy Chief Constable, before promotion to Chief Constable in 1990. During his tenure the crime rate reduced annually. He oversaw the introduction of new technology to enable detection, being one of the far-sighted officers who saw the potential of DNA testing.

Following his retirement in 2000, Bill became increasingly involved in charitable work and other pursuits. He was a member of the Rotary Club, and became honorary vice-president of the Tayside Branch of the Retired Police Officers Association Scotland.

He was also the driving force behind much of St John Scotland's activity in Angus & Dundee throughout the 2000s and 2010s, and was instrumental in setting up a number of projects which continue to benefit the people and communities of the area to this day.

These include the Patient Transport service, which Bill established after learning of the difficulties many local cancer patients faced when trying to get to their treatments. Following discussions with the Scottish Ambulance Service, the scheme was launched in Angus & Dundee in 2008. After a successful initial period, in 2013 the service was expanded to also help renal patients. Bill was instrumental recruiting the team of volunteer drivers, many of whom fondly recall being 'persuaded' into volunteering by him.

Bill also established St John Scotland's groups of First Responders in Angus, keen to help communities who had limited access to emergency healthcare. The scheme began in 2010, with Bill serving as a First Responder himself, as well as organiser of the groups.

Having served as Chair of the Angus & Dundee committee since 2007, Bill stood down in 2013, but remained a key driver of St John Scotland's work locally. He led the Area's work on Public Access Defibrillators, and following the purchase of a first device for Carnoustie in 2016, worked with communities across Angus and Dundee to install 46 more by the start of 2020. Bill was also involved in St John Scotland's fundraising activities, organising an annual Fiddler's Rally at Dundee's Caird Hall each year, and regularly manning the St John Scotland stall at the Glamis Extravaganza.

In recognition of his outstanding service, Bill was admitted as a Member of the Order in 2003, reaching the rank of Knight by 2013. He died at home in Kellas after a short battle with bowel cancer. He is survived by wife Hazel, two daughters and four grandchildren.
